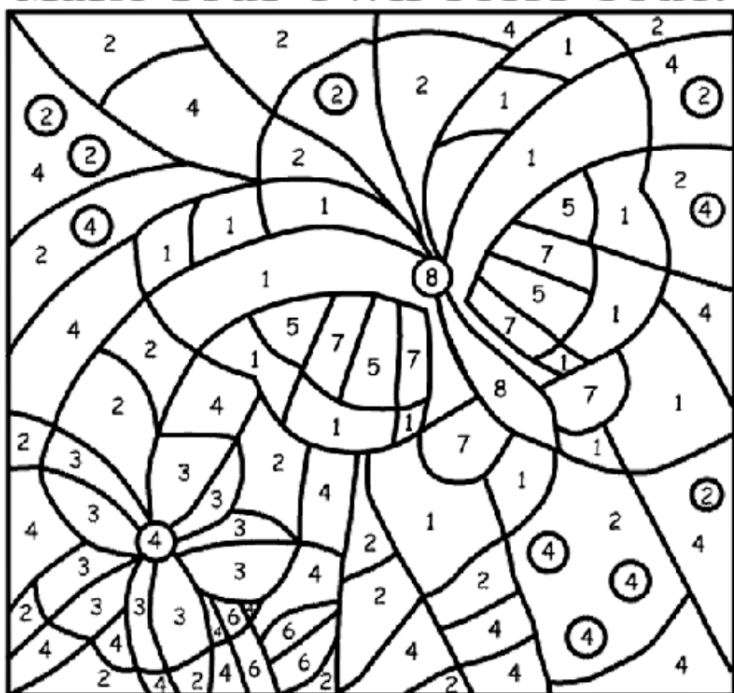


Boza Youth inc has launched at Hilltop Methodist Church, with 33 young people attending.

History of the village

Ann Williams is arranging walking tours for the school, as a form of living history.

This will be set in the year 1911.

She has sent us some background information, as well as facts relating to that year.

Background (before 1911)

The Model Village was built in 1891-5. Before this time all the nearby land, in Carr Vale and up to the Castle, was owned by Abel Charlesworth-Sykes and it had been agricultural/farm land. Sykes went on to have Sherwood Lodge built for him and he lives there.

The Model Village was conceived by E.M. Bainbridge, the managing director of Bolsover

Colliery Company, as part of his vision of better conditions for workers and better relations

between employers and workers. He believed that by providing his men with better housing

than that offered by other colliery companies. He would be able to create a village with no

drunkenness, no gambling and no bad language, and a better feeling between the employers and their employees.

Mr Bainbridge is a mining engineer. From 1895-1900 he was also a Member of Parliament for Gainsborough. When the houses were first built rents were 3s. or 3s.6d. a week.

For some years, New Bolsover has had its own "village bobby" to maintain order.

Mr Bainbridge based the design for the houses on some buildings in a place called Guise, in France. He visited Guise.
