#### **PURPOSE/SUMMARY OF REPORT**

To hear representations made under the Licensing Act 2003 and determine whether to grant an application for a variation of a club premises certificate

#### **REPORT DETAILS**

#### 1. Background

- 1.1 Bolsover District Council is responsible for the licensing and regulation of Club Premises Certificates under the Licensing Act 2003. As part of those responsibilities the Licensing and Gambling Acts Sub-Committee is required to consider any application for a club premises certificate where valid representations have been received and not withdrawn.
- 1.2 The Licensing Act 2003 is clear that four statutory objectives, each of equal importance, must be addressed by the Council when discharging its functions under the legislation.

Those licensing objectives are:

- The prevention of crime and disorder;
- Public safety:
- The prevention of public nuisance; and
- The protection of children from harm.
- 1.3 In addition to the legislation, the Council must have regard to the Revised Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and to the Council's own licensing policy.

- 1.4 The legislation and statutory guidance are clear that each application must be considered on its own merits and in accordance with the licensing authority's statement of licensing policy. Conditions attached to licences and certificates must be tailored to the individual type, location and characteristics of the premises and events concerned. This is essential to avoid the imposition of disproportionate and overly burdensome conditions on premises where there is no need for such conditions.
- 1.5 A premises may only undertake licensable activities where it holds both planning permission and a Club Premises Certificate to enable it to do so. Planning and Licensing are separate systems of regulatory control; planning deals with the use of the land, and licensing with the detailed operation of a premises where licensable activities take place. Similar considerations are likely to arise in both and there is overlap between the two, but each regime involves consideration of different, albeit related matters and each operate independently. The guidance provides that licensing committees are not bound by decisions made by a planning committee and vice versa.
- 1.6 In September 2018 the Council adopted a revised Licensing Act 2003 Policy. A number of paragraphs within the policy are relevant in this case. These paragraphs are set out below:
  - 2.2 In carrying out its licensing functions, the Licensing Authority must also have regard to the licensing objectives, its Policy Statement and any statutory guidance under the Act and is bound by The Human Rights Act 1998. The Council must also fulfil its obligations under section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 to do all that it reasonably can to prevent crime and disorder in Bolsover.
  - 2.4 Guidance on the Licensing Objectives is available on the Government's website at: https://www.gov.uk/guidance/alcohol-licensing
  - 2.5 Licensing law is not the primary mechanism for the general control of antisocial behaviour by individuals once they are beyond the direct control of the individual club, or business holding the licence, certificate or permission concerned. Licensing is about the management of licensed premises and activities within the terms of the Act and conditions attached to various authorisations will be focused on matters which are within the control of the individual licence holder and others.

4.2 The granting of a licence, certificate or provisional statement will not override any requirement of the planning system or vice-versa. The licensing system will provide for the detailed control of operational matters, which are unlikely to be addressed through planning processes. However there will be overlapping issues of interest e.g. disturbance, which will remain material considerations for planning purposes as well as being relevant in terms of the licensing objectives. Applicants should also ensure that they have due regard to any planning restrictions on the use of premises when applying for licence/certification to avoid any possible enforcement action. Equally any planning approval for a premises does not imply that approval will be giving under the Licensing regime.

Further information can be found in the Council's Licensing Act 2003 Policy.

## 2. <u>Details of Proposal or Information</u>

- 2.1 On 18<sup>th</sup> July 2023, an application to vary a Club Premises Certificate for **Whitwell Social Club**, 38 Butt Hill, **Whitwell**, **Worksop**, S80 4RP was received by Bolsover District Council from **Poppleston Allen Solicitors** acting on behalf of **Whitwell Social Club and Institute Limited**. A copy of the current Club Premises Certificate is attached as **Appendix 1** and a copy of the application is attached as **Appendix 2**.
- 2.2 The application seeks to vary the operating schedule to the Club Premises Certificate as outlined below:

Licensable activity	Details of Variation
Supply Of Alcohol	To increase the hours for the supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises to 11:00 to 01:00 hours the following day, seven days per week.

- 2.3 The application has been processed in line with the legislation and all Responsible Authorities were notified of this application.
- 2.4 The Licensing Team did not receive any formal representations from Responsible Authorities.
- 2.5 The consultation deadline for this application was the 15<sup>th</sup> August 2023. By this time the Licensing Team had received two valid representations from members of the public, both of which relate to the prevention of public nuisance. Ms Jill Rafferty's representation is attached as **Appendix 3** and Mr Gareth McGregor and Mrs Lynn McGregor's (also known as Lynn Cottingham) representation is attached as **Appendix 4.**

- 2.6 On 1 August 2023, a further email was received from Mr and Mrs McGregor with additional information to support their representation. The additional information is attached with their original representation as **Appendix 4.** .
- 2.7 These parties have a legal right to make a representation.
- 2.8 During the consultation the applicant engaged in mediation with the objectors and offered the following compromise;
  - The removal of the piano
  - Garden area will be restricted from 10pm
  - Entrance to the Garden Area will be restricted from 10pm
  - Members will leave via the main entrance at the front of the building to minimise disruption
  - Signage will be erected reminding members to respect their neighbours and minimise disruption

Details of the proposal are attached as **Appendix 5.** 

- 2.9 Following this proposal, the applicant's agent confirmed that Mrs Rafferty was happy with the proposals and was withdrawing her representation. However, at the time of this report, the Licensing Section have still not received confirmation of this from Mrs Rafferty.
- 2.10 Following receipt of the objection from Mr and Mrs McGregor, Mrs McGregor has contacted the Licensing Section to indicate they will be entering into mediation with the applicant. However, at the time of this report, the Licensing Section have not received notification that an agreement has been reached.
- 2.11 At the time of the report, both representations remain valid and unresolved.
